UNICAM is the first university in Italy to introduce quality control procedures (ISO 90001:2000, by the certifying company AFAQ France) for all its institutional activities and services.



1.1 A HISTORY OF GROWTH

With its 687 years of history, the University of Camerino is one of the oldest universities in Europe. Over the years, its deep roots have allowed the University to rise high, becoming an established, nationally acclaimed institution, and increasingly expanding its international relevance.

It is a thriving international community that combines excellence in research with a vibrant entrepreneurial culture. Research and teaching are at the heart of the University's mission, and account for its international reputation.

UNICAM has its main offices in Camerino, however, it is present throughout the Marche region. In 2022, for the nineteenth consecutive year, UNICAM ranked first in the CENSIS Ranking of the best Italian universities with up to 10,000 students. Furthermore, UNICAM has signed numerous collaboration agreements with foreign universities and institutions with the aim of offering researchers the opportunity to specialise abroad.



1.2 COMMITTED TO INNOVATIVE AND SUSTAINABLE RESEARCH

UNICAM is open to the new and numerous challenges of the contemporary world, committed to actively participating in building the society of tomorrow. In fact, alongside curiosity, resourcefulness and enthusiasm, we firmly believe that a productive research environment, aimed at satisfying the needs of today's society, cannot ignore the needs of future generations. UNICAM has a "University Coordination Committee for Scientific Research" with the main task of encouraging, monitoring, and reviewing the University's scientific research policies and activities.

1.3 OUR EXPERTISE IN RESEARCH

UNICAM has five University Schools - responsible for Research and Training with scientific, educational and organizational autonomy - with different campuses:

- School of Architecture and Design "E. Vittoria" campus in Ascoli Piceno;
- School of Biosciences and Veterinary Medicine with the Biosciences campuses located in Camerino and San Benedetto del Tronto, and the Veterinary Medicine campus in Matelica;
- School of Law, campus in Camerino;
- School of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Health Products, campus in Camerino;
- School of Sciences and Technologies, campus in Camerino and Ascoli Piceno.

Each School manages its activities in an integrated and culturally oriented international environment and has a wide range of cutting-edge research units.

1.5 RESEARCH INFRASTRUCTURES

UNICAM offers many facilities, providing resources and services for the whole research communities to conduct research and foster innovation in the priority pillars individuated by UNICAM.

UNICAM is constantly pursuing an investment policy with a long-term perspective. Just to mention one of the late investments, UNICAM built in 2021 the Interdisciplinary Chemistry Project (CHIP), which hosts different infrastructures in the field of new materials, agri-food,

health and well-being, sustainable construction, recovery and enhancement of cultural heritage and smart cities.

1.6 INCLUSIVE RESEARCH COMMUNITY

Non-discriminatory policy is part of the University Statute and it is pursued in everyday University life. The University does not tolerate any form of discrimination, and in particular discrimination based on gender identity, nationality, ethnic or social origin, genetic characteristics, language, religion, political opinions of any kind, socio-economic status, disability, age, or sexual orientation.

In 2022, UNICAM published the Gender Equality Plan (GEP) 2022-2024, with the aim of promoting equality.

The GEP was drawn up taking into account the 2030 Agenda of the United Nations to contribute to the achievement of sustainable development at global level.

On these bases, UNICAM has developed an action plan divided into 5 thematic areas:

- Thematic Area 1 Work-life balance and organisational culture.
- Thematic Area 2 Gender balance in leadership positions and decision-making bodies.
- Thematic Area 3 Gender equality in recruitment and career advancement.
- Thematic Area 4 Integration of the gender dimension in research, educational programs, and training.
- Thematic Area 5 Measures against gender-based violence, including sexual harassment.

1.7 RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER OFFICE

University of Camerino has an experienced Research and Technology Transfer Office, whose Research Managers and Administrators work together with Researchers to develop ideas into fundable proposals.

The Research Office is your first contact for research support, contact us at any time!



The office offers consultancy at all stages, from drafting your project idea and identifying funding possibilities, up to the development of the project proposal and management of the funded projects.

While the International Unit supports those researchers who wish to apply for EU and international research fundings, the National Unit provides supports to researchers wishing to apply to Italians funds for research. The team actively monitors funding opportunities targeting young researchers, but also to senior researchers, supporting them in the preparation and presentation of both individual grant and collaborative research projects, assisting them in the presentation of innovative project proposals to competitive calls promoted by the European Commission or other national and international bodies.

Furthermore, knowledge transfer managers support the researcher in scouting and protecting innovation with state-of-the-art research on patent databases and, where appropriate, with patent filing and licensing. Connections with SMEs and industries are open to the transfer of innovation.

1.9 HR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH AWARD


UNICAM has been a signatory to the European Charter for Researchers and the Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers since 2009. This membership is further strengthened by an integrated HR strategy (HRS4R), which has led to the achievement of the award "HR excellence in research". To obtain this award it is necessary to successfully complete a five-step path that qualifies the research institution as a stimulating and creative work environment, encouraging the growth of researchers. UNICAM achieved that goal in 2010, and since then the "HR-Excellence in Research" award has always been renewed – most recently in 2021 for the third time.

UNICAM's quality research has thus been confirmed, and this accreditation, awarded by the European Commission, recognises UNICAM's merit in providing a stimulating and satisfying working environment for researchers.

Great attention is given by the University to compliance with recognised ethical practices and the fundamental ethical principles applicable in the various disciplines in which research is carried out, as well as the ethical standards established by the various national, sectoral or institutional codes of ethics.

UNICAM has its own Code of Ethics and Conduct, and has established the Body responsible for animal welfare (*Italian abbreviation: OPBA*) in compliance with the provisions of Legislative Decree 26/2014.

1.11 EURAXESS SERVICE CENTER

The University of Camerino is part of the Euraxess - Researchers in Motion network thanks to a Services Commitment signed with the European Commission, and is Euraxess Services Centre - one of the reference points of the Euraxess Italy national network. EURAXESS Italy is part of the EURAXESS - Researchers in Motion initiative, it offers targeted information and services to researchers moving to Italy through a national portal and a network of service centres.

UNICAM, as Euraxess Service Centre, provides free and personalised assistance to researchers both electronically and in person (by appointment). 


1.12 CERTIFICATIONS

The excellence of UNICAM's work is also demonstrated by the ISO9001 Certification obtained in March 2022 for design and implementation of activities that include support activities for orientation, tutoring, internships and job placements, as well as international student mobility. UNICAM was the first university in Italy to introduce quality control procedures in its institutional activities according to the UNI EN ISO 9001:2000 standard certified by the GROUPE AFAQ company.

The University - and specifically the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Health Products - has been assigned UNI CEI EN ISO/IEC 17025 accreditation, which attests to the quality and excellence of the chemical-physical and bacteriological research and analysis laboratory on mineral and thermal waters. Currently, in Italy it is the only example of a university laboratory authorised by the Ministry of Health and simultaneously accredited internationally in the mineral and thermal water sector.

The Single-Cycle Master's Degree Course in Veterinary Medicine, offered by the School of Biosciences and Veterinary Medicine of the University of Camerino has obtained conditional accreditation from EAEVE (European Association of Veterinary Training Institutes).

The numerous projects sumbitted and financed at National, European, and International level are the result of the excellent commitment of UNICAM researchers.

2.5 UNIVERSITY LIBRARY SYSTEM

The University Library System is in charge of the acquisition, management, conservation, and fostering of the University's bibliographic and documentary heritage entrusted to it. Libraries allow access to printed books, magazines, catalogues, and databases to be consulted, lent, and reproduced within the limits permitted by current legislation. UNICAM also has free electronic resources. Each library specialises in one of UNICAM's teaching and research areas. The library system also includes equipped classrooms where users can study, find library magazines, and borrow books for exams and research. The University offers assistance and bibliographic information services.

FIRST STEPS IN UNICAM

The administrative and legal management of UNICAM staff, including the research staff, is the responsibility of the HR Department.

Specifically, the Career Management Unit takes care of the activities related to the establishment of the employment relationship and it ensures the maintenance of the legal documents of all staff.

Upon taking up service, the Researcher must go to the Career Management Office for the following obligations:

- contract signature;
- declaration of the relevant researcher's personal and career information;
- filling out forms relating to tax and social security which will be sent to the Financial Resources Area;
- filling out forms relating to the safety conditions and rules of the workplace which will be sent to the Prevention and Protection Service;
- filling out forms of the Infrastructure and IT Services Area which allows the researcher to obtain the activation of a personal email with the @unicam domain and a UNICAM profile necessary to access the University's IT services;
- delivery of an identification badge ID that can be also be used as a door opener to access research facilities and laboratories not equipped with a concierge or when not covered by the concierge service.

If you are a NON-EU citizen:

BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

1. MAKE SURE YOU HAVE A VALID PASSPORT

Your passport must be valid for at least 3 months after the expiration date of your visa or residence permit.

2. OBTAIN AN ENTRY VISA FOR SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

The procedure for granting this type of Visa presupposes the previous issue of a No-Impediment Certificate by the Single Desk for Immigration.

The request for the No-Impediment Certificate is activated by the University, specifically by the Division of Human Resources, Organisation and Development.

To formalise the No-Impediment Certificate request it is necessary to submit the following documents, and provide the following information:

- Reception agreement signed by the University of Camerino and the grant holder/researcher
- Copy of the grant holder/researcher's passport
- Copy of a residence permit, if any, issued for another reason to the grant holder/researcher
- Copy of the university degree
- Copy of curriculum vitae
- Email and/or telephone number on which the grant holder/researcher can be reached
- Indication of the Italian consulate/embassy from which the entry visa must be requested.

The processing time related to the granting of the No-Impediment Certificate is usually not less than 3 weeks.

The No-Impediment Certificate for issuing the visa is forwarded electronically by the Single Desk for Immigration, of the competent Prefecture to the relevant Embassy/Consulate, and a copy is delivered to the University, which will take care of notifying the grant holder/researcher.

Once the "No-Impediment Certificate" has been received, the grant holder/researcher is obliged to go to the Italian embassy or consulate of their country of residence, and request an entry visa.

AFTER YOUR ARRIVAL

3. OBTAIN THE ITALIAN TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

The request to the competent territorial office of the Revenue Agency is formalised via a specific delegation form, by the APOS.

4. APPLY FOR THE RESIDENCE PERMIT FOR RESEARCH

WITHIN 8 DAYS OF YOUR ARRIVAL IN ITALY you must apply for the residence permit.

Once the entry visa has been obtained, the grant holder/researcher must communicate the date of arrival in Italy to the University.

It is important to know this date with at least 10 days' notice, because it will be used to book the grant holder/researcher's appointment at the Single Desk for Immigration in order to start the procedures for requesting the Residence Permit, which usually must be formalised within 8 days of arrival in Italy.

On the day of the appointment the grant holder must present at the Single Desk for Immigration with the following documents:

- Original passport and full copy of the same;
- Certificate of accommodation availability:
 - at ERDIS university facilities: It can be requested directly by the grant holder at the ERDIS offices.
 - in a private apartment: present a copy of the rental contract and the relevant certification of housing suitability;
- Copy of the Tax identification card;
- Copy of the signed research grant contract;
- 1 revenue stamp for the amount of Euro 16.00.

At the Single Desk for Immigration, the grant holder/researcher will be asked to sign the residence contract and a copy of the same must be inserted in the POSTAL KIT available at the Post Offices. The Kit must be filled out by carefully following the attached instructions.

In post offices, at the same time as the parcel is sent, a receipt is issued which contains the date and time of the appointment set with the Police Headquarters to proceed with the fingerprint analysis, and complete the application for a residence permit.

5. HAVE VALID HEALTH INSURANCE

You must have valid health insurance to cover the duration of your stay.

This can be done by either:

- Taking out private health insurance.
- Registering with the Italian National Health System (an annual fee may be required based on the employment contract)

6. OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT


To open a current account in Italy, you need to go to a bank or a post office and ask for information on the costs and methods for activating an account. Each bank varies in terms of costs and procedures. It is also necessary to present the tax identification card (see the dedicated section of this Guide).

Keep in mind that current accounts for non-residents cost more in terms of fees. Depending on your needs, you can choose to open a bank account or get a non-resident debit card. The latter option is much cheaper but offers only one type and a limited number of banking operations, for example salary credit, deposit, withdrawal. Bank transfers are usually not included.

7. REGISTER AT THE TOWN HALL

For non-EU citizens, registration may be required for some administrative formalities (ISEE [Indicator of equivalent economic situation], conversion of driving licence, registration with a general practitioner, etc.), after receiving the residence permit.

REGISTER AT THE TOWN HALL

If you are an EU/EEA/Swiss citizen:

BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

1. HOLD A VALID ID/PASSPORT

Make sure that your ID/passport is still valid.

2. SEARCH FOR ACCOMODATION (INDEPENDENTLY OR SUPPORTED by the HR Department)

Before moving, it is recommended, to book a room for the first few days, and then look for long-term accommodation that suits your budget and needs.

ERDIS (Regional Agency for Entitlement to Higher Education) offers lodging in comfortable student residences in Camerino, Matelica, Ascoli Piceno and San Benedetto del Tronto and also canteens service.

AFTER YOUR ARRIVAL

1. APPLY FOR THE TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

If you hold already an Italian tax identification number (Codice Fiscale), inform your host organisation immediately.

The request for issuance of the tax identification number is forwarded to the competent territorial office of the Revenue Agency, and is formalised, via a specific delegation form, by the Division of Human Resources, Organisation and Development.

2. YOU MUST HAVE VALID HEALTH INSURANCE

You must have valid health insurance to cover the duration of your stay. This can be done by either:

- Taking out private health insurance (before leaving your country, or when you arrive in Italy)
- Holding the EHIC card (European Health Insurance Card). It is issued by the national health service of the country in which you reside. Inquire before leaving your country.
- Registering with the Italian National Health System (once in Italy)

3. OPEN A BANK/POST ACCOUNT

To open a current account in Italy, you need to go to a bank or a post office and ask for information on the costs and methods for activating an account. Each bank varies in terms of costs and procedures. It is also necessary to present the tax identification card (see the dedicated section of this Guide).

Keep in mind that current accounts for non-residents cost more in terms of fees. Depending on your needs, you can choose to open a bank account or get a non-resident debit card. 4. REGISTER AT THE TOWN HALL

EU/EEA/Swiss citizens must register with the Registry Office (*Ufficio Anagrafe*) for a period exceeding 90 days in Italy.

Registration can only be done after finding a place to stay. Contact the Municipal Registry Office (*Ufficio Anagrafe del Comune*). You will be asked to submit specific documents, and may pay a fee.

To call Italy from another country you need to dial 0039 before any number.

However, if you call a foreign country from an Italian telephone,
remember to dial 00 (international prefix) and the prefix of the country you want to reach
before dialling the rest of the telephone number.


If you have a mobile phone we recommend purchasing an Italian SIM card.

This will allow you to call Italian numbers and receive calls from your country at affordable costs. A new Italian SIM costs around 5-10 euros. To purchase a SIM Card you must present a copy of your passport or identity card, an Italian address, and your Italian tax identification card (Codice fiscale).

UNICAM has four campuses:

The town of **Camerino** is located on a hill 661 m. above sea level. Thanks to its position, the town enjoys a healthy climate with brisk winters and warm dry summers. Of pre-Roman origins, the town has played an important political role throughout the centuries attaining a notable level of economic and civil development.

The life of **Matelica**, ancient Roman town as confirmed by many archeological discoveries, revolves around the central square with its elegant seventeenth century fountain. Around it you'll find the town's chief attractions: the Loggia of the Ottoni family, built by the town's ruling family in 1511 and the 13th century Palazzo Pretorio. Visits to the Civic Museum, the Piersanti Museum, the Theatre Piermarini (built at the end of the 19th century in the traditional horseshoe shape) and the City Library are strongly recommended.

Ascoli Piceno is the major town of southern Marche founded by the Italic population of *Piceni*. Though a sizeable town, its historic centre can easily be covered on foot. If you are wandering round the old quarter that stretches from the banks of the Tronto river to the city's main street be sure to walk along the medieval streets where in the past, according to traditional accounts, more than two hundred towers were located. The central historical part of the city is built in a marble called Travertino extracted from the surrounding mountains.

San Benedetto del Tronto is one of the main holiday resorts of southern Marche. With over 7,000 palm trees on its wide promenade, it has a touch of tropical charm. It is also a thriving town that doubles as one of the most important fishing ports on Italy Adriatic coast. In summer San Benedetto del Tronto is a popular resort with a lively nightlife. The castle and narrow streets of brick houses can be seen in the old part of the town.

CORSA ALLA SPADA E PALIO

Corsa alla Spada (Race to the Sword) is an ancient Renaissance tradition linked to the feast of the patron saint of Camerino, martyr San Venantius of Camerino.

The participants are the terzieri (Italian for subdivisions of towns divided into three districts), each represented by 10 athletes who, running a distance of approximately 1,300 meters, through the streets of the historic centre, compete for the sword hoisted on the corner of the church of Santa Maria in Via, symbol par excellence of chivalry and of great captains such as those from the Italian noble family Da Varano, awarded to the winner; and for the red velvet banner (Palio), awarded to the best team.
