

Dear Students, dear Colleagues,

In compliance with the Prime Ministerial Decree of 3 November 2020, and the Orders of the President of the Marche Region No. 41 of 2 November 2020 and No. 42 of 5 November 5 2020, and in accordance with the provisions of the Regional Committee for the Coordination of Universities in the Marche Region, Universities in the meeting of 6 November 2020, we communicate, until further notice, the methods of carrying out the teaching activities.

All lectures must be carried out online, with the exception of those of the first year of bachelor's, master's and single-cycle master's degree programs, which can be carried out in mixed mode (face-to-face and using the virtual classroom, with recording of the lectures), in compliance with current regulations regarding the distancing and tracing of access.

Laboratory activities can be carried out face-to-face, even at affiliated facilities, where required, in compliance with current regulations regarding the distancing and tracing of access. Laboratory field trips are also to be considered as such.

Exams must be held "exclusively online", as defined and regulated by the Rector's Decree of 17 August 2020.

Internships, thesis-related activities, and job placement programs may be carried out face-to-face, as they may not be postponed and are indispensable for the conclusion of the university courses, in compliance with current regulations regarding the distancing and tracing of access.

All activities are subject to the specific needs of students with disabilities.

As already communicated in the past, libraries and study rooms remain accessible, in compliance with current regulations regarding the distancing and tracing of access, subject to further provisions on university teaching methods, referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree of 3 November 2020.

We are once again facing a challenging and certainly not an easy period, but our university community has always been able to respond with determination to any challenge; We are confident that, this time too, we will succeed in doing so, with professionalism, caution, respect for the rules, and being fully protected in carrying out our daily work activities. In this regard, as already announced on several occasions, Unicam is organising a Serology Testing service, offered free of charge and on a voluntary basis, to all staff members who request it, and which will be activated shortly. In the coming days we will provide more details and news on the subject.
