Prerequisites:

Law degree or Political Sciences degree or a comparable university degree.

Presentation:

The Scuola di Specializzazione in Diritto Civile (Specialty School in Private Law) enhances the knowledge of students and trainees for the legal professions about all the fields of the Private Law: Law of the Persons, Family Law, Successions Law, Contract Law, Law of Obligations, Property Law and Law of the Interpretation.

Students will obtain the diploma of specialised in Private Law.

- 1) The length of the course is three years.
- 2) Each year is made up of 100 hours of teaching (including conferences).
- 3) Attendance of course is compulsory and, in any case, it can't be less than 2/3 of the total amount of the hours.
- 4) At the end of each year, students will be able to pass an examination covering the entire program.
- 5) In order to obtain the diploma, students should be able to discuss a final dissertation in one specific issue relating to one subjects of the course.
- 6) Maximum number of students allowed each year is 100.

Objectives of the Specialty School

Students specialised in Private Law are able to:

- have a critical understanding of the relevant issues subject of the course.
- use the hermeneutic approach in order to get an adequate understanding of the legal system.
- have a particular degree of autonomy in the hermeneutic operation.
- clearly transmit the juridical solutions in each professional area of the law.
- use the skills learned over the 3 years of the school in each professional area of the law, with regard to the Private Law.

In order to achieve the abovementioned objectives, the activities of the Specialty School aim at

- acquiring the basic knowledge of the various fields of the Private Law, having also regard to the communitarian and comparative law notions.
- acquiring the adequate method of interpretation, with regard to the evolution of the legal system.
- acquiring the adequate skills in order to contemplate juridical solutions that best fit with the evolution of the legal system.

Job opportunities:

Skills acquired will be used in each professional area of the law as well as in public or private bodies.

Organization:

Lessons will be held from May to October of each year. Examinations and final dissertation will take place three times each year.

Services:

Three fellowships will be provided on the basis of a written examination. The date of the examination will be fixed on the website.

Furthermore, three fellowships for foreign students will be provided.

Students may apply for an internship in private/public bodies both during the three years of the course and within the period of 18 months from the date of the diploma.

Students may take advantage of the facilities of ERSU (accommodation and cafeteria) and of the Carta Raffaello (for services).

Final examination: dissertation and diploma

The final examination will consist of a dissertation on a selected issue and will enable the student to obtain the diploma of specialised in Private Law.
