Prof. Andrea Spaterna, born on August 21, 1962, in Perugia. In 1987, he graduated with full marks and honours in Veterinary Medicine at the University of Perugia and he started his career on 1990 as Researcher at the Institute of Special Pathology and Veterinary Internal Medicine within the same university. In 1998 he started working at the University of Camerino, where since 2005 he is Full Professor.

He focused his expertise on Internal Medicine, dedicating himself to both clinical practice and extensive research. His contributions include authoring more than 230 publications in prestigious national and international journals and proceedings, in addition to securing 4 international patents. His research spans various areas, encompassing the development of innovative therapeutic protocols for conditions such as canine pyoderma, dermatophytosis in dogs and cats, cat herpes-virus infections, cat squamous cell carcinoma, canine periodontal diseases, intestinal pathologies in dogs, articular cartilage lesions in horses, equine myopathies, cognitive dysfunction in elderly dogs, as well as the treatment of bedsores and ulcerative lesions.

He is also the author or editor of following books: “Dermatologia del cane, dal segno clinico alla diagnosi e terapia” (2008); “Prontuario dei Principi attivi negli animali da compagnia ed esotici” (2011), “Guida terapeutica degli animali da compagnia” (2016), all published by Le Point Veterinaire Italie - Milan, as well as author of 5 book chapters.

He currently teaches semiotics and veterinary medical pathology, as part of the single-cycle master's degree course in Veterinary Medicine, as well as clinical medicine and therapy within the School of Specialization in Animal Health, Breeding and Livestock Production.

Former Unicam Pro-Rector for Relations with public and private bodies and institutions in the territory, from 2011 to 2017, and Unicam Pro-Rector for Territorial Cooperation and Third Mission, from 2017 to 2023, he currently holds the following positions: President of the Sibillini Mountains National Park; Health Director of the University Teaching Veterinary Hospital - Unicam; Vice President of the Board of Directors of the Regional Agency for the Right to Education (ERDIS); Coordinator of the Permanent Council for Territorial Development; President of the Interuniversity

Center for research and consultancy on dog genetics; Responsible for animal welfare and care at the University animal facility - large animal section.
