Lécia Vicente is a Visiting Professor of Law at the University of Camerino, where she teaches a series of seminars on the United Nations 2030 agenda for sustainable development and corporate governance. She is also the founder and principal of a global law observatory for business, where she analyzes evolutionary trends in the law of the United States and around the world. Lécia has advised government officials in the United Nations, was the Henry Plauché Dart Endowed Assistant Professor of Law at the Louisiana State University Paul M. Hebert Law Center, and a Lecturer at the University of Illinois Gies College of Business. Her research focuses on studying market structures across jurisdictions and how those structures impact institutions, organizations, and traditional legal concepts and potentiate or thwart human development, including socioeconomic development. Her scholarship has been published or is forthcoming with Springer, Cambridge University Press, Wolters Kluwer, Hart Publishing, Intersentia, and Oxford University Press. Additionally, her work has been published in law reviews in the United States. She holds a Ph.D. degree from the European University Institute in Florence, Italy. Her expertise has been utilized in various research projects at the University of Camerino, the Institute of Social Sciences at the University of Lisbon (ICS-UL), and the UC Berkeley School of Law.
