This online seminar, led by Professor Lécia Vicente, runs in parallel with the in-person activities led by Professor Lucia Ruggeri at the European Commission and Vrije Universiteit Brussel in Brussels from 9 to 13 June 2025. Professor Ruggeri's sessions address the digital-ecological transition from a legal perspective, cross-border family patrimonial regimes, and the legal and territorial frameworks underpinning a sustainable, cross-border energy future. Inspired by the "Cross-border Energy Futures conference (12 June 2025, 10:00 CEST, Brussels) hosted by the European Commission Directorate General Regional and Urban Policies and organized by Professor Lucia Ruggeri, Professor Lécia Vicente will facilitate a student forum on building a truly cross-border, sustainable, and inclusive clean-energy future. Participants will explore:

1. Corporate governance strategies;
2. The role of AI, corporate law, and finance in decarbonization;
3. Sustainability frameworks seen through a "law-as-infrastructure" lens.

Through an academic-enterprise case study, students will apply these concepts to real-world business models.
